Thank you for your patience as we all work to get through this challenging time.

Lincoln-Way 210 is focused on providing the best possible academic experiences for students while adhering to the academic, health, and safety requirements set by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) and the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH).

As of this date, District 210 continues to plan to return to in-person learning using Blended Learning - A/B Days. Additional information on Blended Learning-A/B Days can be found [HERE](#).

As this is a very fluid situation, there is still the possibility of beginning the school year, or at some point moving to, Remote Learning.

Our teachers and administrators are preparing for both options, developing flexible and adaptable plans that are aligned to guidance from the ISBE and IDPH.

As of this afternoon, approximately 200 students have chosen to opt out of returning to school in-person via Blended Learning-A/B Days. The original deadline to opt out was Sunday, July 26. Parents will now have until Wednesday, July 29, at 5 p.m. to opt out by completing the [Remote Learning Request Form](#).

By choosing the Remote Learning option:

- Students may not follow a traditional schedule.
- Courses will be offered based upon enrollment and availability.
- The method of delivery may consist of a combination of synchronous learning with a teacher outside of school hours and/or a curriculum delivered through an online learning platform.

Students who opt out of Blended Learning-A/B Days and choose Remote Learning will be contacted the first week of August.

The safety of our students and staff is our primary focus, and these plans will evolve as we receive additional guidance from ISBE, IDPH, and the Will County Health Department.
